The course will count as three credits applied to the graduation requirements of the AA in Criminal Justice (63 credits total), the AAS in CJ (62 credits total), or the CJ Certificate (31 credits total).

Credit will be given only as a Criminal Justice Elective and only to students who matriculate in one of the above specified CJ program. For an AAS in CJ graduate who goes on to enroll in the four-year BAS in CJ program, the course would apply to 123 credit requirement to receive that degree.

The course would not count toward the General Education requirements of other degrees. The University specifies which courses may used to satisfy those requirements, and all such courses are university courses taught both in Morgantown and in Keyser. Criminal Justice is not part of the university curriculum, and CJ courses are offered only in Keyser.
